On the 26th day of June 1821 personally appeared
in open Court being the Court of Common Pleas and
Court of Record for Jackson County aforesaid agreeable
to the Statute in that case made and provided: Henry
Koughs aged sixty nine years who being duly sworn
agreeable to law doth on his oath declare that he is a
resident Citizen of the County of Jackson and
State of Ohio aforesaid; and that he served the
United States in the Revolutionary War as follows
to wit; he enlisted in the year 1799 for eighteen
months in a Company commanded by Captain
John Anderson, which said Company belonged
to a Regiment commanded by Col. ~~Waters of the~~
North Carolina Line on the Continental establish-
ment, was in the battles of Guilford Courthouse, Stone
Springs, and in several other skirmishes and was
wounded at the Battle of Camden, And that he
was discharged from the service in the year 1781, by
Major Smead at Salisbury N. Carolina; & that some-
time about the 1st day of July in the year 1818
pursuant to an Act of Congress, entitled An act
to provide for certain persons engaged in the land
and Naval service of the United States in the
Revolutionary War ~~and~~ ~~he~~ ~~was~~ ~~present~~ on the 18th
day of March 1818 he appeared and obtained a
pension certificate No 9369, bearing date the 16th
day of April 1819, awarding him on the
pension

Pension Note of the Ohio Agency as of per Month
 And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident
 Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of
 March 1818, and that I have not since that time
 by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property
 or any part thereof with intent thereby to diminish
 it as to bring myself within the provisions of an
 Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide
 for certain persons engaged in the Land and
 Naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary
 War passed on the 18th day of March 1818, and
 that I have not nor has any person in trust
 for me any property, or securities, contracts, or
 debts, due to me; nor had any income, other
 than what is contained in the schedule here to
 annexed, and by me subscribed, to-wit;

	One man worth	10.00
	3 Some beading of small value worth	10.00

Making in all not more than fifty dollars 50.00

My Occupation is that of a Farmer but am
 unable from age & infirmities to do much; My
 Family consists of my self, my wife who is
 an old woman does not know her age, but she
 is so infirm as to be unable to do much I own
 a son 17 years of age, who are dependent
 upon me for support and without the
 assistance

importance of my Country I am not able to
Support myself & family
