On this twentieth day of September

Amos Dornier one thousand eight hundred and ninety seven came personally before me the subscriber presiding the board of commissioners of the said county James Hulse resident of said county State of Ohio in his sixty third year of his age who after being sworn according to law in order to obtain the provision made by the act or letter an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in revolutionary war passed by Congress in March 1818. deposed and said that he resided at the plantation on the Patuxent river Virginia in or about harvest before the battle of Brandywine the year not recollected for three years in Captain Abraham Sheppards company in regiment commanded by Colonel James Wood number of regiment the twentieth of Virginia line in continental service and saw a service the whole three years in said corps and discharged at <sup>Friedrichsburg</sup> ~~Fredericksburg~~ Virginia after guarding prisoners from the low country he believes in Jersey some time after expiration of enlistment was in the battle of Brandywine Germantown Paulskirk &c. that he is in reduced circumstances and much needs the assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence in his possession or power to prove the said service.

Done at Washington before me the day and year first written.

Jackson in said State of Ohio  
James House personally  
appeared in open Court this 10th day of Feb. 1819  
said James House aged 50 years, resident  
in said Jackson County who being first duly sworn according  
to law with oath declared that he served in the  
revolutionary War, in the Virginia Continental line  
for the term of three years for which he received a bounty in  
said State that he enlisted at Sheppards town  
Va. in the Company commanded by Captain  
Abraham Shippen and served under him in the  
Virginia Regiment that on application at  
the war department he received a pension certificate  
No. 15,709. Inscrubing him the said James House  
on the pension roll of the Ohio agency at the rate of  
eight dollars per month to commence on the 10th Sept. 1819  
dated 9th November 1819. And that the said James House  
do solemnly swear, that he was a resident Citizen of  
the United States on the 18th day of March 1818  
and that he had not since that time by gift sale  
Or in any manner disposed of any property or  
any part thereof with a view or intent thereby to dem-  
= inish it so as to bring any self within the provisions  
Of an Act of Congress passed the entitled  
Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the  
Land and Naval service of the United States  
in the Revolutionary War passed on the 18th day  
March 1818. and that he have not nor has any person

~~from~~ in trust for me, any property or securities contracts  
or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what  
is contained or debts due to me, nor have I any income  
other than what is contained in the schedule hereunto annexed  
and by me subscribed = Two old Horses = Two old  
leaves, ~~two young~~ Horses = Two cows, ~~three~~ sheep, one  
black wagon ~~and~~ pigs, And the said Horses & the  
said ~~other~~ ~~by~~ ~~occupation~~ ~~a~~ ~~farmer~~, and of an

been nearly as old as myself, and now and two  
daughters living with me the oldest nearly eighteen  
and the younger about fourteen these constitute my  
family & of the said things you are to give in  
rendering a permanent support the Department can

render me comfortable within doors which I trust  
they spare from without which God grant I may be  
enabled to do me any year, but of which without  
fearing aid I am apprehensive

Madam:

I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S. 41666 it appears that James Hulse enlisted in Shepherdstown, Virginia in harvest time 1777, served as a private in Captain Abraham Shepherd's Company, Colonel James Wood's Virginia Regiment, was in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown and Paulus Hook, and served three years.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 13, 1819 while a resident of Ross County, Ohio aged sixty-two years.

In 1821 he was living in ~~Washington~~ <sup>Jackson</sup> County, Ohio and referred to his wife nearly sixty-six years, and two daughters aged about eighteen and fourteen years, all living with him, no names given.

The above history is that of the only soldier by that name, or any similar spelling of the surname, of Ross County, Ohio, found on the Revolutionary War records of this Bureau.
