The State of Ohio

On the eighth day of September in the Year

above said one thousand eight hundred and thirty two  
personally appeared in person before the Court of Common  
Pleas of the County of West and State of Ohio - John Foster a resident  
Citizen of the County of West and State of Ohio aged thirty six years  
who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath  
make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit  
of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June 7 1832  
that he served in the War of the Revolution in a Company commanded  
by Captain Simon Morgan in the North Virginia Regiment  
under the command of General Richard Campbell. His  
Deposant further deposes and swears that on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of Jan  
1819 obtaining the honor of the Secretary of War of the U. S. Army  
upon the 29<sup>th</sup> day of May 1820 received a pension Certificate  
numbered 17192 - that he is the identical John Foster named  
in said Certificate of Pension - the Deposant further deposes  
and swears that on the twenty fourth day of May 1827 he made  
application for a continuance of his pension which is as  
follows, (see copy exhibit A) a copy of which this Deposant  
causes to be on file on these several occasions to be forwarded  
to the Honorable the Secretary of War - And to which this  
Deposant has received no answer - And the reason why  
is unknown to this applicant - His Deposant further deposes  
and swears that he is now a resident Citizen of the County  
of West and was so at the time of his original application.

The Deposant humbly begs the Department  
of War to give to this applicant all the relief that the peculiar  
Circumstances of his case may require. And that he may  
have the benefit of his application to the 28<sup>th</sup> day of May 1827 -  
Subscribed and sworn to this 8<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 in open  
Court -

This day personally appeared in open court Job Foster aged seventy one years  
and resident in the county of Scioto and made the following declaration in order  
to Entitle himself to the benefit of an act of congress Entitled "An act to  
provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the  
Revolutionary war passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818<sup>th</sup> <sup>May 1<sup>st</sup> 1820</sup>  
State of Ohio, Scioto Court of Common Pleas, Scioto County ss.

And now at this day, to wit, on the twenty fourth day of May in  
the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven,  
personally appeared in open court, of and for the county of Scioto  
=now Pleas of Scioto County and the state of Ohio, and a court of re=  
=cord, Job Foster aged seventy one years resident in said County of Scioto  
aforesaid, who being first duly sworn in due form of law, doth on his oath  
declare and state, that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows. In a company  
commanded by Captain Simon Morgan in the ninth Virginia Regiment, under  
the command of Colonel Richard Campbell for the term of eighteen months  
commencing some time early in the fall of the year 1780, and ending on the  
first day of January 1782. This deponent further deposeseth and saith that  
on the twenty eight day of June in the year of our lord one thousand eight  
hundred and nineteen he this deponent petitioned the Honorable the  
Secretary of war of the U. S. and upon the twenty ninth day of May 1820  
Received a pension certificate numbered 476192. And that the said Job  
Foster do solemnly swear that he was a resident citizen of the United  
States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818. And that he has not since that  
time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of any property or any  
part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to being myself

within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "An act to provide  
for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United  
States in the Revolutionary war passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818  
and that I have not nor has any person for me in trust or otherwise any  
property or securities, contracts or debts due to me nor have I any in some  
otherwise than that which is contained in a schedule hereunto annexed,  
and by me subscribed. (Schedule)

One horse best eight years old . . . . . \$20.00

One milch cow and one three year old heifer \$15.00

And this deponent further deposes and saith, that at the time  
of the discontinuance of his pension aforesaid, the health of this  
deponent was very good considering his advanced age, and this deponent  
by his personal exertions was enabled to obtain a daily subsistence.  
And this deponent further deposes and saith that the increased age,  
ill health, and infirmity of this deponent at this time are such that  
he this deponent is unable to labour for his daily subsistence, and has  
no other resource for subsistence, than the assistance of his country.  
And further this deponent saith not. (Signed) <sup>his</sup> J<sup>ts</sup> X Foster

In Nov 1819 of Seale Co Ohio Aug 1824 of Wayne Twp 1829 of 7/1/31

Entered in March 1819 with Capt. <sup>S. Morgan</sup> Morgan of Co. R. 1st Regt. of the 9th Mass. to Winchester where he remained during the winter, then went to Fredricksburg to Petersburg & Charles City & joined the army Guilford Co. N. C.

Two days after the battle (Mch 15 1781) He joined in the Pursuit of Lord Cornwallis at Deep River from Waverly to Combs Co. where he was in the second battle of the Clouds (Apr 25 1781) He was drawn back about 12 miles but the British evacuated Combs (May 6 1781) Foster returned to Fort Mifflin on May 10 1781 He became engaged in a number of skirmishes He was ordered to the High Hill of the Clouds where he was about 3 miles from the army of the British on May 17 1781
