Declarations in order to obtain the benefit
of the Act of Congress of the 7th June A.D. 1832,
State of Ohio Jackson County

On this 19th day of September A.D. 1832
personally appeared before the Judges of the Court of
Common Pleas of Jackson County Ohio, J. L. Orrison,
Jones, a resident of Madison Township in the
County of Jackson State of Ohio, aged ~~forty~~
eighty two years next March, who being
first duly sworn, according to law, doth on
his oath make the following declaration,
in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions
made by the Act of Congress, passed June 7th 1832,
That he ~~submitted~~ joined the Army of the United
States, and entered its service under the following
named officers and served as he is stated,
That is to say: That sometime during the Rev-
-olutionary War, the year, by reason of his age
and loss of memory he is unable to state,
and when he resided in Charlotte County
Va. he was drafted into the Militia service
for a term of three months, & into the Com-
-pany commanded by Capt. Tho^s. Williams,
& Lieutenant Wm. Marshall, who were under
the command of Col. Tho^s. Reed - That
he marched from Charlotte Co. Va. to
Gates defeat in North Carolina, where
he served during the term afo^{re} and was
dismissed at Hillsborough in North
Carolina - That some considerable time after
he returned home, he thinks some years, tho^ug
to time he is not certain for the reason
afo^{re} he enlisted, at Charlotte Co. Va.
where he still resided, in the Company
commanded he thinks (but of this he is
not positive) by one Capt. Sandford - That
his Company was under the command
of Major Edmund there a Neigh^t town
of his at that time, who is long since de^{ad}.
That the period for which he enlisted he
thinks was five years - That immediately
after the enlistment afo^{re} he was sent by
Major Reed, in company with a brother

in law of his to Bolebough Co. to bring down to
Prince Edward Co. eight or ten miles, two miles,
which service he performed - That he was
afterwards for ~~some~~ days engaged, by the
direction of the ~~General~~ ^{Major}, in collecting several
houses that had strayed, that belonged to
the Light Horse - said ~~General~~ ^{Major} Regiment
being a Light Horse Regiment - That under
this enlistment he served six months, when
he was discharged, by writing, under the
hand of ^{Major} ~~the~~ ^{Head}, (which has been since lost
by time & accident) at Charlotte Court
It appears that the ^{af} Major, at the time
he was discharged, was acquainted with
the condition of his family, and knew that it
was large, consisting of a wife and eight
or nine children; that he was in indigent
circumstances; which and that they required
his personal attention and care, which he
thinks was the reason of his being discharged
as ^{af} - That afterwards, and when he
was residing in Halifax Co. Va. he was
drafted as a soldier for a term of six
months, into the Company commanded
by Capt. Paulam Booker, under whom
he marched to the lower part of said
County, where he hired a substitute and
returned home - That in the year 1884
& when he was about to move to Petersburg
Va. the ^{af} ^{Major} ~~the~~ ^{Head} gave him a recommend-
ation which is herewith forwarded to the
Department of War - That he has no document-
ary evidence, and that he knows of no person
whose testimony he can produce, who can
certify to his service - That he was born
in fourth Carolina in 1751; that he formed
the Record of his age in his Bible taken
from his Father's Bible, both of which have
been long since worn out - That he resided
in Campbell Co. Va. for thirty odd years, since
the Revolution; that in 1819 he moved to
Ohio; and has lived for about five years
past in Jackson Co. O. where he now lives -

He hereby relinquishes every claim
whate'er to a Pension or annuity
except the present, and declares that
his name is not on the Pension Roll
of the Agency of any State -

day of Sept. A.D. 1832

We Theophilus Blake, a Clergyman & Son of Radabaugh
resident of Jackson County, Ohio, do hereby
~~certify that we~~ ^{are} well acquainted
with the said Jones, who has subscribed
and sworn to the above declaration,
that we believe him to be eighty
two years of age; that he is reputed
and believed in the neighborhood
where he resides, to have been a
soldier of the Revolution, and that
we concur in that opinion -
